Wisdom Unsearchable

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday when Jesus rode into Jerusalem. As He drew close to the beloved city, people laid down their cloaks as well as tree branches to hail Him as King. This type of parade was culturally appropriate for that time and place. Victorious Roman generals would ride their proud steed into Rome or wherever they were victorious with the army following immediately behind. After that would come the slaves, the victims of that particular battle. Paul writes of this in his second letter to the church in Corinth chapter 2 verses 14-16: 'Give thanks to God! He always leads us as if we were prisoners in Christ's victory parade. Through us, God spreads the knowledge of Christ everywhere like perfume. God considers us to be the pleasing smell that Christ is spreading. He is spreading it among people who are being saved and people who are dying. To those who are dying, we are the smell of death. To those who are being saved, we are the perfume of life.'

The arrival of Jesus in Jerusalem proved equally divisive. There were many who expected a political revolution with Jesus at the head of an army triumphing over Rome. However, those more observant would have noted that Jesus wasn't riding on a beautiful, majestic war horse, but on a colt or small donkey. Quite possibly, his feet would have trailed along the ground as he went! The King of all Kings, whose teachings and miraculous powers have not been matched before or since was fulfilling the prophesy of Zechariah: "City of Zion, be full of joy! People of Jerusalem, shout!

See, your king comes to you. He always does what is right. He has won the victory. He is humble and riding on a donkey. He is sitting on a donkey's colt." (Zechariah 9 v 9).

We will be singing 'Meekness and Majesty' at some points over Easter, and I encourage you to meditate on the great words by Graham Kendrick:

**'Wisdom unsearchable, God the invisible, love indestructible in frailty appears. Lord of infinity,
Stooping so tenderly, Lifts our humanity to the heights of His throne.'**
